All Students will listen actively in a variety of situations to information obtained from a variety of sources.

• Participation in workshops and speeches provides students exposure to a variety of presenters and issues related to agriculture. [Standard 3.2 – Language Arts Literacy]

All Students will speak for a variety of real purposes and audiences.

• Through public speaking and job interview Career Development Events, FFA members will gain the ability to speak in a variety of situations. [3.1 – Language Arts Literacy]

All Students will learn democratic citizenship and how to participate in the constitutional system of government of the United States.

Knowledge of democratic citizenship and the constitutional system is stressed through the use
of parliamentary procedure, the development of policy and the election of officers. [6.1 –
Social Studies]

All Students will use critical thinking, decision-making, and problem-solving skills.
